Marco Weber, Ph.D., received his Ph.D. in psychology from the University of Zurich, Switzerland. Since fall 2016, he is visiting professor for psychological assessment, evaluation, and intervention at the Technical University of Darmstadt, Germany. From 2005 to 2016 he worked as a teaching and research associate as well as visiting professor at universities in Germany, USA, and Switzerland. In his research, which is located in the field of positive psychology with a special focus on personality psychology and psychological assessment, he focuses on the relations between and the assessment of determinants (e.g., broad and narrow personality traits like big five traits and character strengths, respectively) and indicators of individuals' well-being and mental health broadly construed (e.g., global and domain-specific life satisfaction, positive and negative affect) in different nations (e.g., Germany, Israel, Switzerland, USA), and across the life span with a current focus on (but not limited to) childhood and adolescence. He has published in scientific journals (e.g., *Child Indicators Research*, *Journal of Adolescence*, *Journal of Happiness Studies*, *Journal of Individual Differences*, *Personality and Individual Differences*), and delivered talks internationally on his research topics at academic conferences. He is member of the International Positive Psychology Association (IPPA), the European Network on Positive Psychology (ENPP), and the German Psychological Society (DGPs). Furthermore, he is member of the editorial board of the recently founded *Journal of Positive Psychology and Well-Being (JPPW)*.
